Examples of four coastal art styles are accompanied by explanatory text. Volume 2 puts First Nations art into a cultural context, providing Native Indian philosophy, knowledge and skills foundation, code of ethics, and interviews with a contemporary First Nations family and a description of the Potlatch.
