Books 1, 2, 3, and 4 include word bank cards, mini-readers and five animal theme units per book. Includes blackline masters for classroom use for word recognition, context clues/cloze, sentence starter, comprehension questions, rhyme/choral reading and word bases. Books 5,6 and 7 reinforce the first 180 basic sight words. The sight, sound and spell key program teaches students to associate sounds and pictures with word spelling.
