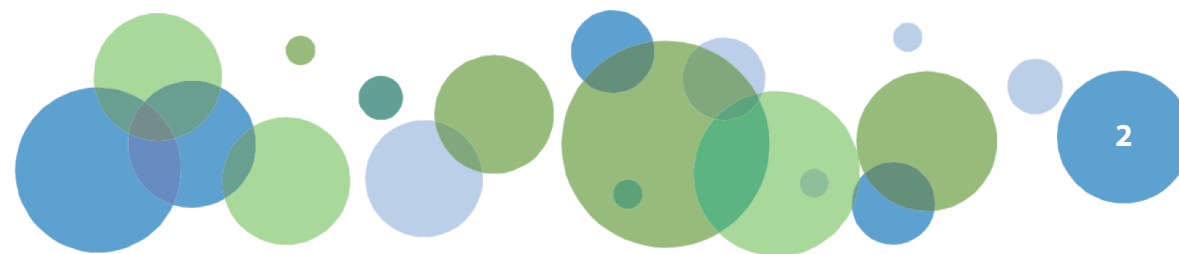


WHY?: Catchment Review

- ☐ School Act requires that schools have catchment boundaries.
- ☐ 2 new schools being constructed to open in September 2022.
- ☐ Existing Boundary / catchment lines need to be adjusted to create boundaries for the new schools.
- ☐ Balancing enrolment across schools to minimize overcrowding and portables.
- ☐ Continued work with the Ministry of Education for future schools in recognition that growth will continue and this process will continue to unfold.



WHAT?: Proposed Changes

Elementary

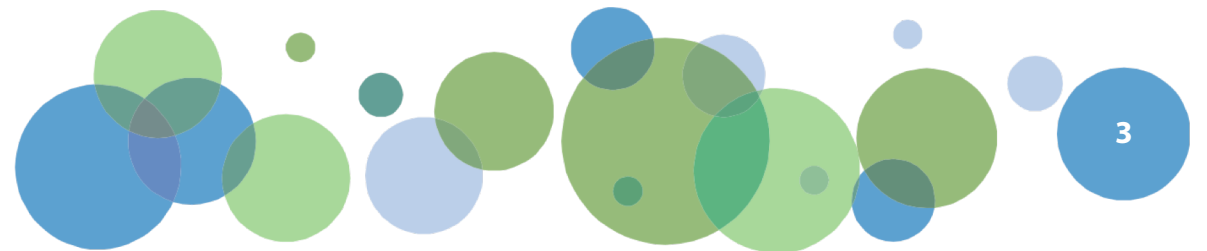
- Adjusting boundaries for Happy Valley, Willway, Ruth King, David Cameron and Colwood.

Middle

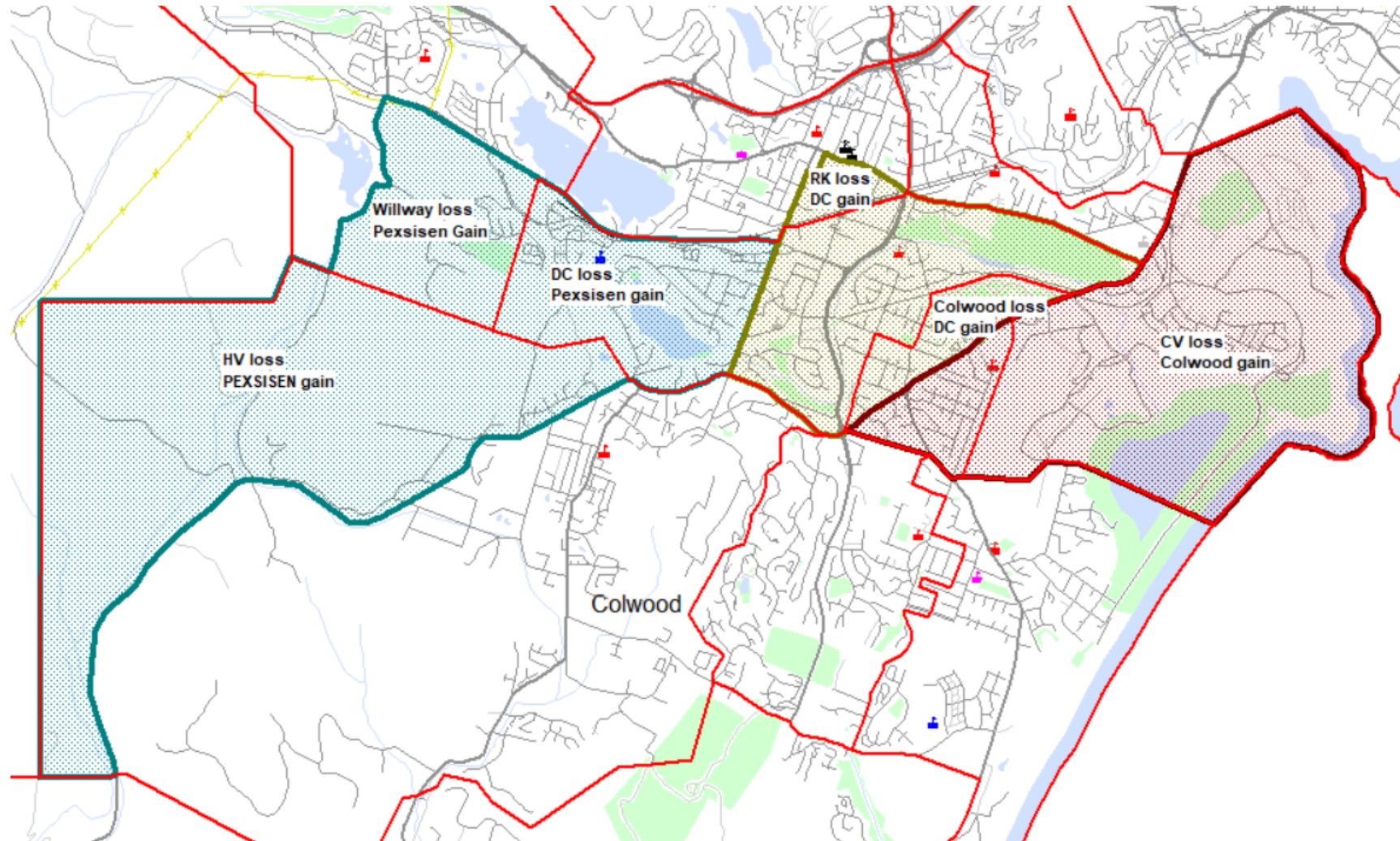
- Adjusting boundaries for Dunsmuir and Spencer

Resulting Challenges:

- Leaves Colwood with few students and projections for stable enrolment.
- Reduces the overall enrolment in Spencer and Dunsmuir by redistributing to Centre Mountain Lellum.
- Three middle schools, Spencer, Centre Mountain Lellum and John Stubbs feed Belmont, leaving Dunsmuir to feed Royal Bay.
- Long-term projections would show that Royal Bay would drop in enrolment to approximately 800 and Belmont would grow to approx. 1700.

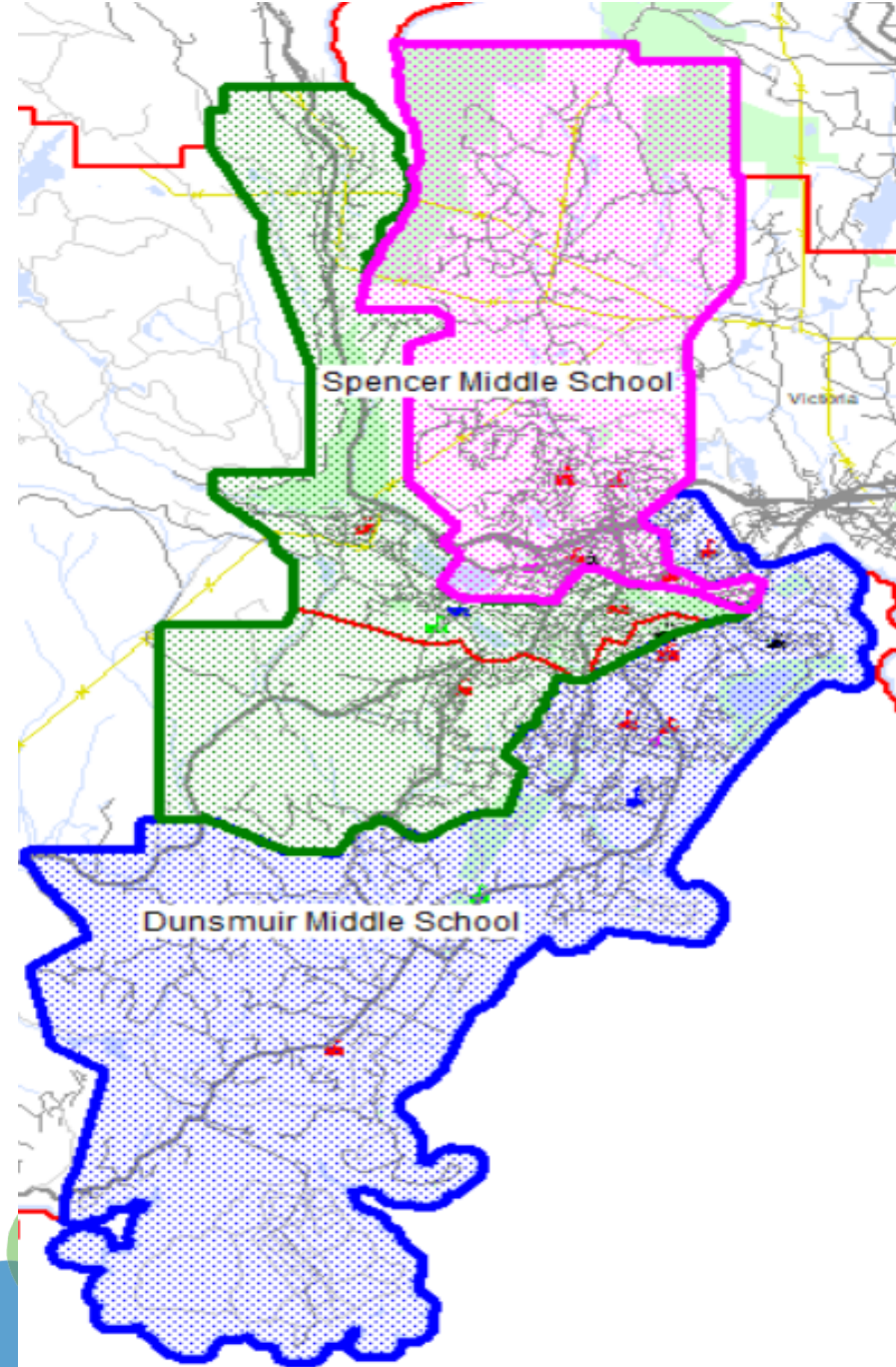


Neighbourhood Elementary Map (proposed changes)

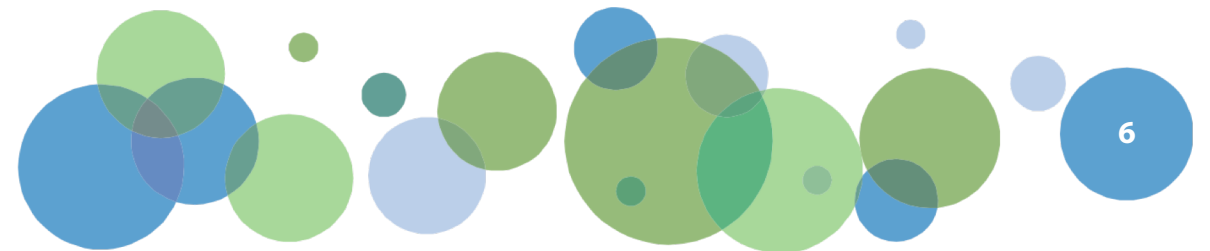

HOW?: Proposed Changes

Colwood Elementary:

- Aligning English language students from Belmont Park to Colwood.
- Supports Colwood's long-term enrolment- no long-term forecast for growth.
- Closer proximity and connection for Belmont Park families to their schools.

Crystal View Elementary:

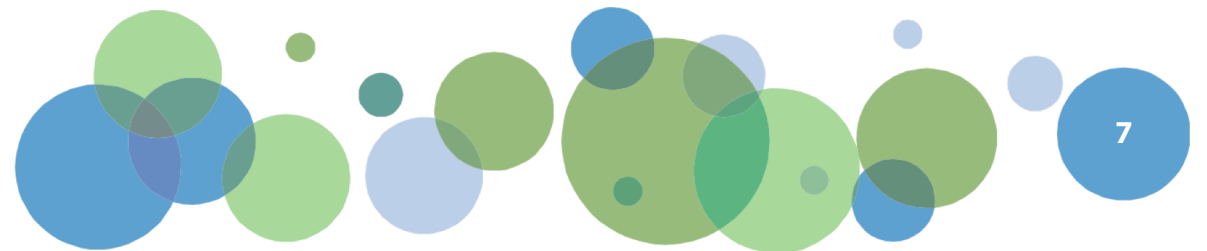
- Crystal View's enrolment declines, no long-term forecast for growth.
- Elementary French Immersion moves from Millstream to Crystal View.

Millstream Elementary:

- Both Lakewood and Millstream are full with no space for additional portables; continued projections for growth at both schools.
- Relocating FI to Crystal View manages enrolment on the North Side of the Hwy until growth necessitates the construction of a new elementary school on the Board's property in North Langford.

Royal Bay:

- French Immersion moves from Belmont to Royal Bay to balance enrolment.
- Royal Bay: John Stubbs & Dunsmuir
- Belmont: Centre Mountain Lellum and Spencer would feed



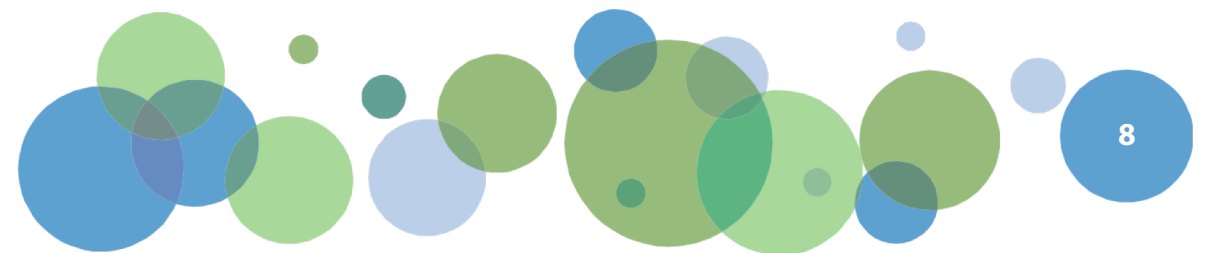
French Immersion

2022- Middle/ Secondary

- Secondary French Immersion program moves from Belmont to Royal Bay through a gradual transition process.
- ***Grade 8 students at Ecole John Stubbs Middle may begin attending Royal Bay in Sept. 2021.***
- French Immersion students currently attending Belmont will complete their dual dogwood at Belmont.

2022- Elementary

- French Immersion program at Millstream moves to Crystal View.



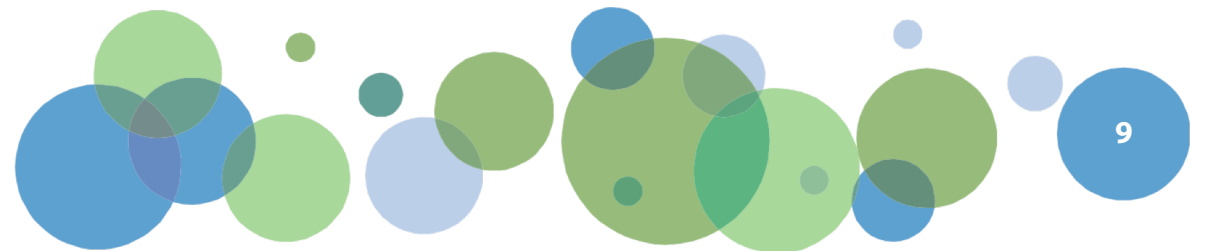
When

September 2022: Pexsisen Elementary and Centre Mountain Lellum open

September 2022: New catchment boundaries are introduced

Staggered Option: Early Transition for French Immersion (Sept. 2021)

- Enrolment pressures at Belmont.
- Current Grade 8 FI class at John Stubbs = 100. Usually it is ~60.
- Result = consider moving class to Royal Bay for Grade 9 in September 2021.
