SUPERVISES: N/A

JOB GOAL: To assist in the care of students who are dependent on others for medical

needs, dressing, feeding, toileting, mobility and /or personal hygeine. May also monitor and assist students during structured and unstructured time such as recess, lunch hour, before and after school period and

between classes.

PERFORMANCE RESPONSIBILITIES:

Under the supervision of the teacher:

- 1. Assists the teacher and/or administration in duties relating to the care and supervision of students who are dependent on others for medical and personal care at any point of a school day.
- 2. May assist the teacher and/or administration in duties relating to supervision of assigned students in activities such as individual or group field trips.
- 3. Participates in staff discussions of individual students programs, and acts as a member of a team to set individual goals pertaining to physical functioning.

- 4. Works with individual students in developing skill areas such as self-help skills and in reinforcing concepts not mastered.
- 5. Maintains records of work and observations if requested.
- 6. Reports safety issues or unusual behavior to the Special Education teacher.
- 7. Ensures students enter and exit the school safely, as required.
- 8. Attends to minor cuts or bruises as required, and supports the monitoring and care of additional health matters as directed by trained medical staff via Care Plans.
- 9. May be assigned supervision duties specific to each school.
- 10. Supervises the transfer of students to and from appropriate buses, as required.
- 11. May be required to work outside in inclement weather.
