

2014-15 SPEAC Events

Meetings

Our meetings are usually held on the third Wednesday of each month. We try to rotate the location of our meetings through the different schools in the school district. For 2014/15 we met in the following locations:

All Candidates Meetings

We hosted two All Candidates Meetings: November 4th, 2014 at EMCS Theatre for the Milne's Landing Zone Candidates and November 6th, 2014 at Spencer Middle School for the Belmont Zone Candidates.

The purpose of these meetings/forums were to introduce the candidates to the parents in the school district, but they were also open to all voters in the areas. These forums gave parents the opportunity to meet the candidates, ask questions about issues that were important to them, and hear the candidates' responses.

PAC 101 and Nutrition Night

SPEAC has an annual PAC 101 night and this past year we tried something a bit different. We included vendors that are used by various PACs in the district to fundraise via hot lunch sales. This gave PACs the opportunity to try samples of the foods they would sell to our kids, to meet the vendors and ask them questions.

We had Janet Krenz, Island Health, talk with our parents about the new Guidelines for Food & Beverage Sales in BC Schools. These guidelines pertain to all events/vending machines at schools that sell food and/or beverages.

We had the following round-table discussions:

- How to hold an effective meeting
- Secretary role and responsibilities
- Treasurer role and responsibilities
- Gaming grants and fundraising
- Hot lunches

Our goal was for PACs to network with one another, get the information/resources they needed, and to share what they learned with their PACs. We had great feedback from parents and are looking forward to this event on October 15, 2015 at Belmont Secondary.

BCCPAC Fall Conference

In November 2014, the conference was held at the Vancouver Island Conference Centre, in Nanaimo, BC. Due to the convenient location of the conference, we were able to have a high representation of parents attend from our school district; eight parents from SD62 attended the conference!

The Keynote speakers included the following:

- Kevin Cameron, Open vs. Closed School Dynamics and the Role Parents Play in it!
- Gary Anaka, The Teenage Brain
- Carol Ann Fried facilitated a discussion, *Moving Forward: A Conversation about Education*

There were several education sessions that included the following:

- What Parents Need to Know About Violence Threat Risk Assessment (VTRA) in BC Schools
- Residential Schools
- Brain Wellness for Parents
- Little Red Riding hood and Why Parents Should Support Drug Policy Reform in Schools
- And more

The conference ended after a discussion on the classroom resource fund (CRF). The discussion contained information about how the concept of the CRF was developed, information about the purpose of the CRF, how the CRF would be used to resource classrooms, why the CRF is a viable option, and direction from the PACs on how they wanted BCCPAC to proceed with the CRF.

All Presidents' Dinner

We held this event in January 2015 at the SBO. Presidents and Vice Presidents of SD62 PACs were able to network, share information, and provide valuable feedback to SPEAC. We will be hosting a similar event at the Whitespot Restaurant, in Langford, on November 5, 2015.

Vancouver Island Parent Conference (VIPC)

We worked with the Victoria Confederation of Parent Advisory Councils (VCPAC) to host a conference that parents would find meaningful and valuable. Last year, the theme was "School Wellness: Mental, Physical, Emotional, and Spiritual" and the VIPC was held at Spectrum Community School. There was some live streaming of the sessions held in the theatre, which were recorded as podcasts and VIPC provided the links to all attendees.

The keynote speaker was Robin Grill, from Australia, who spoke to parents about *"Love, Fear, and Shame in Education"*. Featured speakers included Gary Anaka, the Brain Guy, and Brenda Whittam-Neary. In February, we hosted this event at Dunsmuir Middle School. The speakers included Jennifer Gibson aka "The Sex Lady", our very own Cindy Andrew, and RCMP Cst. Scott Rothermel, SD62's Community Liaison Officer.

They provided parents with important up-to-date information to support their teens in today's world. They discussed issues facing today's youth; consent, pornography, sexuality, drugs, social media, and decision making.

The event was so important that parents asked for another session to be held in Sooke. Our speakers agreed and they held a second session at Journey Middle School in May 2015.

Child & Youth Mental Health Forum

Our Healthy Schools Committee worked with the F.O.R.C.E. Society to host this informative session on National Mental Health Day, May 7th, at Spencer Middle School. Parents learnt what they could do to promote the mental health of their children and about helpful resources that are available in our communities.

The Healthy Schools Committee is looking at doing a similar event in May 2016.

Promoting Mental Health Forum

This forum was an idea that came from our 2013/14 Healthy Schools Committee. One year later, they were able to make their vision a reality. The one-day conference was titled, *"Promoting the Mental Health of Our Children and Youth: A Comprehensive School Centered*

Approach", was funded by a Healthy Schools BC School District Readiness Grant, and organized by a CRD-wide Healthy Schools Mental Health Forum Planning Committee.

This event had over 200 attendees from the south island school districts. The attendees included parents, educators, administrators, and trustees; but the most powerful attendees were the students. Their voices were so powerful and one student in particular brought the entire room into tears.

PAC Summit & End of Year Celebration

We held our 2nd Annual PAC Summit & End of Year Celebration in June at the JDF Kinsmen Fieldhouse. Our featured speaker was our very own Dave Betts, Assistant Superintendent, who shared information about Bill 11 and how it differs from SPCs. We had two keynote speakers:

- Nancy Walt, Director of Curriculum and Assessment Learning Division, Ministry of Education, discussed the new approach to how curriculum will be taught to our students and how it differs from previous practices.
