Could be issues about having all kids registered for the official count Sept. 30.</li> <li>The ministry has stated 'no excuses' numbers need to be in even if their system is at fault for delays.</li> <li>Aboriginal Ed gathering October 6 at Ruth King</li> <li>His school visits start next week, tries to visit all schools at least three times a year, some he sees much more often</li> <li>District Day September 20 very entertaining and educational.
