## What is AVID?

AVID is a program designed to prepare students in the academic middle for admission to post-secondary universities and colleges.

AVID students learn and develop skills to improve their academic success throughout their school careers.

## Student Profile

- 2.0 to 3.5 GPA (C to B+)—with a desire to do better
- appropriate classroom behaviour
- good attendance
- motivation to challenge him/herself
- demonstrated a consistent work ethic

## Where else is AVID taught?

AVID is an international program, adopted by over 3,500 schools in 45 states as well as 15 countries through the US Department of Defense Dependent Schools. AVID has been taught in select BC schools for over 7 years and enters its fifth year at Belmont. Next year, **AVID 10, 11, & 12** will be offered.

## What do students do?

Students learn study and organizational strategies, writing to learn skills, and probing-question development. As well, students get academic help from peers and college tutors, and participate in enrichment and motivational activities that make going to college seem realistic.

## Expectations

- 1. Maintain a C average (minimum).
- 2. Enroll in academically challenging courses.

3. Commit to one hour of homework 5 nights/week.

4. Attend classes regularly.
