What is a skilled trade?

A skilled trade is an occupation that requires a particular skillset, knowledge base or ability. You see the evidence of skilled trades every day—when you walk into a building, drive down the road, go to a restaurant, or simply turn on a light. And with over 100 trades to choose from in B.C., there's something for everyone.

What is a trade apprenticeship?

An apprenticeship is a combination of on-the-job training and classroom learning that leads to a trade credential. You can be an apprentice during or after high school, and most apprenticeships take about four years to complete. For 6 to 10 weeks every year, you'll be in a training facility; the rest of the time you'll be learning on the job. Once you complete your apprenticeship and receive your ticket, you'll be qualified to work in a skilled trade.

FINANCIAL SUPPORT

Registered apprentices may be eligible for the following financial support:

WORKBC APPRENTICE SERVICES

—temporary financial support during inschool portion of training.

GRANTS

-cash grants for Red Seal apprentices of up to \$2000 and \$2500 for completion.

TAX CREDITS

-income tax credits from the B.C. government.

CANADA APPRENTICE LOAN

—interest-free loans to help with the cost of training.

EMPLOYMENT INSURANCE

—temporary support while attending approved training.
