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Dear Families:

I hope this letter finds you and your families healthy and well, adjusting to the new way of connecting and learning while in-class instruction is suspended.

I am very proud of our students for quickly adapting to learning remotely and connecting with their teachers in new and different ways. Having said that, we are also aware that the COVID-19 pandemic can cause worry or anxiety for students that they may be having difficulty coping with. We have created a page on our external website designed for students as a place to turn if they need

Our hope is that students who might want to reach out have a place to find the assistance they need quickly and confidentially. We are sharing it with you for your information and as a way for you to start a conversation with your children, should you need it. We will be sharing the page with teachers as well so they can pass it on to students, especially those they feel may benefit from it.

I also want to remind parents that Monday, April 27th is a professional development day for teachers. Even though schools are closed to in-class instruction, our dedicated teachers must still be afforded the time to continue their learning and development. What does this mean for you and your children? It means that on Monday teachers will not be contacting students, while they engage in their own professional learning. While it is not mandatory, we suggest your students plan to dedicate some time to their school work. In times such as these, routine is important. Even if the routine is different from what we recognize as the norm. We appreciate you supporting your teachers in their professional development as you do in their efforts to connect with and instruct your children.

We continue to connect with those of you who are Essential Service Workers (ESW) as deemed by the provincial government as well as those who utilize our food services program. We want to remind you that our care for children of ESW is not structured like a normal in class school experience. We are providing care and limited learning opportunities and continue to develop the program as it unfolds. We are still planning for the safest way to return student belongings to families. Information on this will be coming to families shortly. We have focused on returning essential items such as medication, followed by critical learning supplies and then personal belongings. At this time, we continue to ask families not to attend at our schools, unless by appointment.
