# **COVID-19 Supports**

### **Teacher Contact and Student Work Expectations**

A reminder that although each teacher has their own teaching style, they are required to connect with your student at least twice during the week. For your reference, students in K through grade 5 should be assigned approximately 5 hours of work per week, , middle school (grades 6 through 8) should be assigned between 6 to 7 hours of at-home school work per week and for secondary students, there should be 2 to 3 hours per week, for each of their current courses. We don't want to overwhelm families and are attempting to balance school work expectations with the challenges and demands of your home. If you find the work being assigned to your child(ren) poses a challenge in your home, please connect with your teacher to discuss.

## **Student Belongings**

We know many of you are anxious to get your child's belongings from their school. We have developed a plan for safe access to our buildings to accommodate you. Procedures will differ from school to school and specifc instruction will come to you from your school. At this time, we expect to start inviting you in to retrieve your items May 19<sup>th</sup>.
